It covers the complete range of ballet movements, including barre work, center work, adagio, allegro, and pointe work. The Vaganova method also places great importance on proper body alignment, coordination, strength, and flexibility. It aims to create dancers who have a solid foundation in classical ballet technique and are capable of performing with grace, precision, and artistry.
